d'Annuncio sent large amounts of war material to the Radic followers.

Furthermore, Radic is in touch with Stambulinski¹⁶¹ and he is associated with the wide revolutionary organization which the Bulgarians are supporting in Albania, Macedonia, and Montenegro. The war preparations in Bulgaria are being carried on a large scale. The Bulgarians are concentrating troops on the Serbian front. Stambulinski's mission in Prague was a complete failure, however in Warsaw an agreement was reached which has for its purpose an association between Poland, Romania and Hungary against the combination of Czecho-Slovakia, Jugo-Slavia and Italy. This combination was promoted by the Bulgarian Minister Sawow Michael¹⁶² at the instigation of Marshall Foch, with whom he is very intimate.

Dr. Basaricek¹⁶³, a delegate of the Peasant Republican Party, has visited Belgrade, and on the 17th and 18th January, he met representatives of most of the Parliamentary groups. Dr. Basaricek has reported that he found the majority of the delegates to the Parliament in favor of the sovereignty of the "Constituante", as against that of the Ministry, and, in view of this circumstance, he has expressed the hope that all the deputies of the Radich party would be able to go to Belgrade eventually.
