Sir:

I have the honor to refer to my despatch No. 2783 (860H.00/258) of the 17th instant, relative to the internal political situation, reporting the adjournment of Parliament on the 4th instant after the passage of certain laws mentioned.

The great enthusiasm demonstrated by the public at Zagreb over the King's presence at the Croatian Millennium Celebration on July 15th was mentioned as was Mr. Stepan Raditch's somewhat conspicuous part in the same. The public press of the country has continued to portray this event as one of very considerable political importance, in which the press of Zagreb showed no less enthusiasm than that of Belgrade, and there can be no doubt that it is significant as evidence of the present rapprochement between the Serbs and the Croats.

Mr. Stepan Raditch again visited Belgrade on the 19th instant particularly to confer with Dr. Nintchitch, the Foreign Minister, over the programme to be adopted by the Yugoslav delegation to the assembly of the League of Nations at Geneva, of which, as heretofore reported, he is a member. As on the occasion of his previous visit his presence here was a source of much interest to the population of Belgrade and his reception was entirely cordial. Dr. Nintchitch himself has recently gone to Bled, where His Majesty is still sojourning, to discuss with the latter the Geneva programme.

With the adjournment of Parliament and the usual summer holidays the situation at Belgrade and throughout the country generally as regards internal politics has

been uneventful since the date of my last despatch. It is reported that the Prime Minister, Mr. Pashitch, after being much benefited by his cure at Carlsbad has gone to Evian-les-Bains, on Lake Geneva, and is not expected to return to Belgrade before the middle of next month. It is probable that Dr. Nintchitch and possibly Mr. Raditch will take advantage of their sojourn at Geneva to confer with Mr. Pashitch.

There appears at this moment to be nothing of further interest in this connection to report.
